I'd also been talking to a metalwork teacher I knew only from conversations on Facebook. He was doing some great stuff with his high school students with blacksmithing.

A very good friend and one of our biggest cheerleaders, Meredith, sent me an ABC article about the resurgence around the country of classes in Traditional trades and skills post Covid. She also sent one about Blacksmithing classes being run in Queensland.

Meredith planted a seed for us that is growing and blossoming into a behemoth that we didn't realise could exist. We introduced our Grandfather Trades classes.

In May we offered our first blacksmithing class with Brett and Lisa Inch travelling from Temora to run the classes for us.

In May I put out feelers through various social media groups for passionate people with skills that would be willing to teach traditional skills and trades.

We ran our first Soapmaking class in June, and leatherworking premiered in June as well. Jan Kates travels from near Queanbeyan to teach our soap making class each month. Geoff Poultney comes from Ardlethan to share his skills and knowledge in leatherworking.

We also began offering a woodworking class, with our 5 Board bench beginning in June (IT WAS A VERY BUSY MONTH!!)

We've also added another woodworking class with Planter Boxes premiering in November, along with Wool Felting taught by the marvellous Mary Casey from Griffith, and Beginner MIG Welding kicked off in November as well. Alex Dean nervously stepped up to the plate for that one, and knocked it out of the park.

Along the way, there's been newspaper articles, TV news stories, Mentions in NSW Parliment by our local Member (Thanks Steph Cooke), and a lot of laughs with some amazing people.

Because as much as these courses are about the skills, they're more about the people. We've met such a huge array of people over the last twelve months in this little community that is building.

We've had 170 people through the doors to do classes. If the weekly woodworking classes were counted as new people every week, that number would be closer to 700. Each person is a unique individual with a story of their own, a life that they've lived, and experience to share. Conservatively that number is closer to 150 with repeat customers.

That's mindblowing for what began as a couple of questions, random facebook interactions, and the sharing of some news articles.

There's been some sleepless nights, wondering if people were interested, or were going to turn up, or if the planning was correct for a new class. Usually for nothing, but it's a little worrying at times!

There's another couple of weekend woodworking classes that I'm looking to add, building an Adirondack Chair, and possibly a Workbench Building class.

I'll also be offering a Friday morning Beginner Woodworking class, running from 10-12.

If you know of anyone that is passionate about a traditional trade or skill, please get them to talk to us. We'd definitely love to talk to them.

As for us, well we're about to start our Christmas School holidays. Part of that will be doing further improvements to our workshop and outdoor learning spaces, adding storage and more lighting. We're also going to have a bit of a beach holiday, because if we don't get away, I'll just keep working!

Before I sign off for 2023, I really have to thank the brains behind the operation, my awesome wife Beck. She does all those little things in the background which make it easier for me to do the classes. And the big things.....possibly all the things. Introduction to DIY Tools: Got a shed full of tools, and don't know how to use them? Always had someone that told you not to worry about that tool, it was too dangerous, or the wrong tool, or you were the wrong gender to be using <u>ANY</u> tools?

This class is for you.

Our Instructors will run you through a variety of common DIY power tools available at any hardware store, and show you how to use them safely. We'll go into maintenance and accessories, storage and how to choose the right tool for the job.
